Sometimes I was reminded that I had no idea what it meant to truly be hungry. I am grateful that I was taught that truth. I am also sobered by the reality that I have never truly felt hunger (even with brief fasts) while many others have.

"Everyone feels their hunger for God in particular ways and..."

We hunger for many things. Yes, as our stomachs shrink, we are reminded of our fondness for food. We go several hours without anything to drink and we are thirsty. We've been through quite a winter and we long for warmth and green in abundance. Hunger also describes our longing for union with God...union with God's mercy as well as God's strength to help us when we are uncertain or afraid. Everyone feels their hunger for God in particular ways and uses different ideas and words to express it. Hunger is a response to our incompleteness. Hunger is prayer. This season of Lent can be a tool to focus our hunger into prayer. We are reminded that our fulfillment is found ultimately in God's mercy.

Like the disciples despairing the loss of their teacher and friend, we wait. They did not know that the resurrection would become their hope and peace. They were surprised. We also do not know the color, or shape, or texture of the fulfillment of God's mercy for our longing. This makes our waiting for Easter real except it is not a 3-day process, but a life-long process. I am sure it was so for the disciples/apostles, too. We wait. We hope.

Please give generously toward the bundles we are collecting for Lutheran World Relief which will be given to refugees and disaster survivors. These will all provide hope and comfort far beyond the slight cost to us. During Lent and Easter we are also collecting funds toward a massive synod wide event to assemble 300,000 meals to be distributed locally. The total cost to our synod churches will be \$75,000. That is a quarter per meal. New Hope Ministries and the Central PA Food Bank will receive most of these meals to use in their usual distributions of food. Our goal is to raise \$1,300 between our Parish and Christ, Filey's. Hundreds of workers will be needed throughout the day on Thursday June 5th to assemble the meals at Messiah College which has donated the space for the assembly.

May we be mindful of our hunger which is prayer!

MORE THAN A DAY

How much do you know about
EASTER?

Easter. For many, it's a day to get dressed up in new clothes and go to church. It's filling Easter baskets and baking a ham. And there's probably more than one chocolate bunny involved! However, for Christians, the Easter celebration isn't a single day. And it's definitely not about the bunny.

Easter Sunday—the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus Christ and one of the most significant Christian holy days—is the realization of God's promise of eternal life. It's the culmination of a season of preparation and the beginning of a joyful feast.

The preparation for Easter actually starts 40 days earlier on Ash Wednesday, which begins the season called Lent. The last days of Lent, from Palm Sunday to Holy Saturday, are known as Holy Week. After Easter is a season called Eastertide, the 50 days from Easter to Pentecost Sunday. While not all Christian churches recognize these days and seasons in the same way, many Christians are familiar with them.

See what you know—or learn something new:

? WHERE DOES THE WORD "EASTER" COME FROM?

Surprisingly, there's no definitive answer. It might have come from the Anglo-Saxon word "ostre," which some believe meant "the month of opening." Or it could have come from the old German word "auferstehung," which meant "resurrection."

? WHY DOES EASTER'S DATE CHANGE EVERY YEAR? CHRISTMAS DOESN'T.

The early church debated whether they should celebrate Easter on the same day each year like Christmas or whether it should be a "moveable feast." Since Sunday was associated with the Resurrection (three days after the crucifixion), in A.D. 325, the church decided to make Easter the first Sunday after the first full moon that follows the March equinox.

? WHAT DO THE ASHES SIGNIFY ON ASH WEDNESDAY?

In some churches, leaders put ashes on their congregants' foreheads on this first day of Lent as a reminder of mortality and repentance. Some churches burn the previous year's palms from Palm Sunday to make the ashes for Ash Wednesday.

? WHY THE "PALM" IN PALM SUNDAY?

When Jesus rode through Jerusalem on a donkey the Sunday before His resurrection, a huge crowd followed Him and waved palm branches to honor Him. (John 12:12-19) Some churches repeat the waving of palms on this Sunday to commemorate this historical Christian event.

? WHAT IS "MAUNDY THURSDAY," AND WHAT DOES "MAUNDY" MEAN?

"Maundy Thursday," which occurs three days before Easter Sunday, comes from the Latin *mandatum novum*, which means "new commandment." At the Last Supper, Jesus told His disciples: "A new commandment I give you, that you love one another." (John 13:34) Jesus expressed that love by washing His disciples' feet. "The Teacher is washing His disciples' feet, and they should be willing to do the same," says Timothy Butler, chaplain at Lindenwood University in Missouri. Some churches include the washing of feet during Maundy Thursday services.

? JESUS DIED ON GOOD FRIDAY, SO WHAT'S "GOOD" ABOUT IT?

In many other languages, this Friday before Easter Sunday is called Holy Friday. It's not entirely clear how the day became Good Friday in English. However, since Christ accomplished salvation through His crucifixion on this day, Butler believes "holy" and "good" are the same in this instance.

? WHEN DID JESUS GO TO HEAVEN?

Eleven of Jesus' apostles witnessed Jesus ascend to Heaven 40 days after Easter Sunday. (Acts 1:9-11) Some churches celebrate that day, called Ascension Day.

? WHAT IS PENTECOST?

Pentecost Sunday celebrates the coming of the Holy Spirit 50 days after the Resurrection. Before Jesus was crucified, He told His disciples (John 14:16-18) that the Holy Spirit would come after He died. Fifty days after Jesus was resurrected, His disciples felt the presence of the Holy Spirit and began to proclaim the Gospel of the risen Christ. (Acts 2:1-41) ■



THE PASSOVER SEDER is a Jewish ritual feast that marks the beginning of the Jewish holiday of Passover. It is conducted on the evening of the 14th day of Nisan in the Hebrew calendar, which corresponds to late March or April in our calendar. The Seder is a ritual performed by a community or by multiple generations of a family, involving a retelling of the story of the liberation of the Israelites from slavery in ancient Egypt found in the Book of Exodus. The Seder itself is based on the Biblical verse commanding Jews to retell the story: "You shall tell your child on that day, saying, 'It is because of what the LORD did for me when I came out of Egypt.'"

(Exodus 13:8) Traditionally, families and friends gather in the evening to read the text of the Haggadah, which contains the narrative of the Israelite exodus from Egypt, special blessings and rituals, commentaries, and special Passover songs. Seder customs include drinking wine, eating matza (unleavened bread), partaking of symbolic foods placed on the Passover Seder Plate, and reclining in celebration of freedom. The Seder is performed in much the same way by Jews all over the world.

Jesus, being an observant Jew, celebrated the Passover Seder with his disciples. It was at a Passover Seder that Jesus gave new meanings to the cup of wine and to the matza (bread). This meal is commonly referred to by Christians as the Last Supper.

Filey's will be offering an opportunity for all to come and experience this Jewish tradition of the Seder meal on **Thursday, April 17 at 6:00PM**. People of all ages are welcome to come and enjoy this casual and meaningful meal of fellowship and education. Not only will we be tasting the traditional Seder foods such as: Maror (bitter herbs), Charoset, Karpas (vegetables like parsley), Z'roa (roasted lamb), and Beitzah (hard boiled eggs), but there will be a full meal consisting of chicken, potatoes, vegetables and desserts. We are asking for a **\$10 donation** per adult to defray the cost of the meal. No refunds given. Children under 12 years of age will be free. Please remit payment at time of registration. **Deadline to register is April 13.**

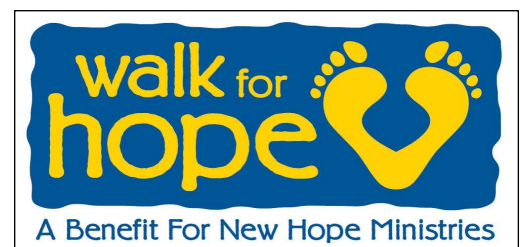

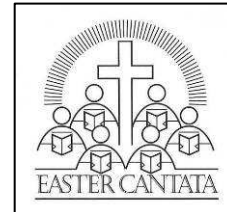

June 6-7, 2014

Messiah College, Grantham

The 2014 **Lower Susquehanna Synod Assembly** will gather on **Friday, June 6** and **Saturday, June 7**. As the highest legislative authority of this synod, voting members from congregations engage in conversation, vote on resolutions, synod council and board nominations, worship, and learn together as a community of faith. Registration opened on-line March 1.

What better way to begin our Synod Assembly, with this year's theme of "Feeding the Hungry," than by actually doing that? We are partnering with Thrivent Financial and Messiah College to sponsor a food packaging event that will provide 300,000 or more meals to people in central Pennsylvania. This mammoth event will take 12 hours, 900 volunteers (working in 2-3- hour shifts) and \$75,000 to meet our goal.

The Candy - The day of Resurrection was thought of as an entry into paradise. In the Hebrew Scriptures, when you enter paradise, you receive milk and honey and other festive foods. "So the candy is a modern

playing out of the more ancient milk and honey," explains Richard Priggie, chaplain at Augustana College in Illinois.

The Bunny - The treat-toting Easter bunny seems to have been born in Germany in the late 1600s. Children would build nests for the bunny to leave their treats in--the origin of the modern Easter basket.

Colored Eggs - The ancient Egyptians exchanged red-colored eggs in honor of spring. This custom spread to the Greeks and Romans and then to the Europeans. In medieval times, eggs were forbidden during Lent, making them a popular treat on Easter Sunday.

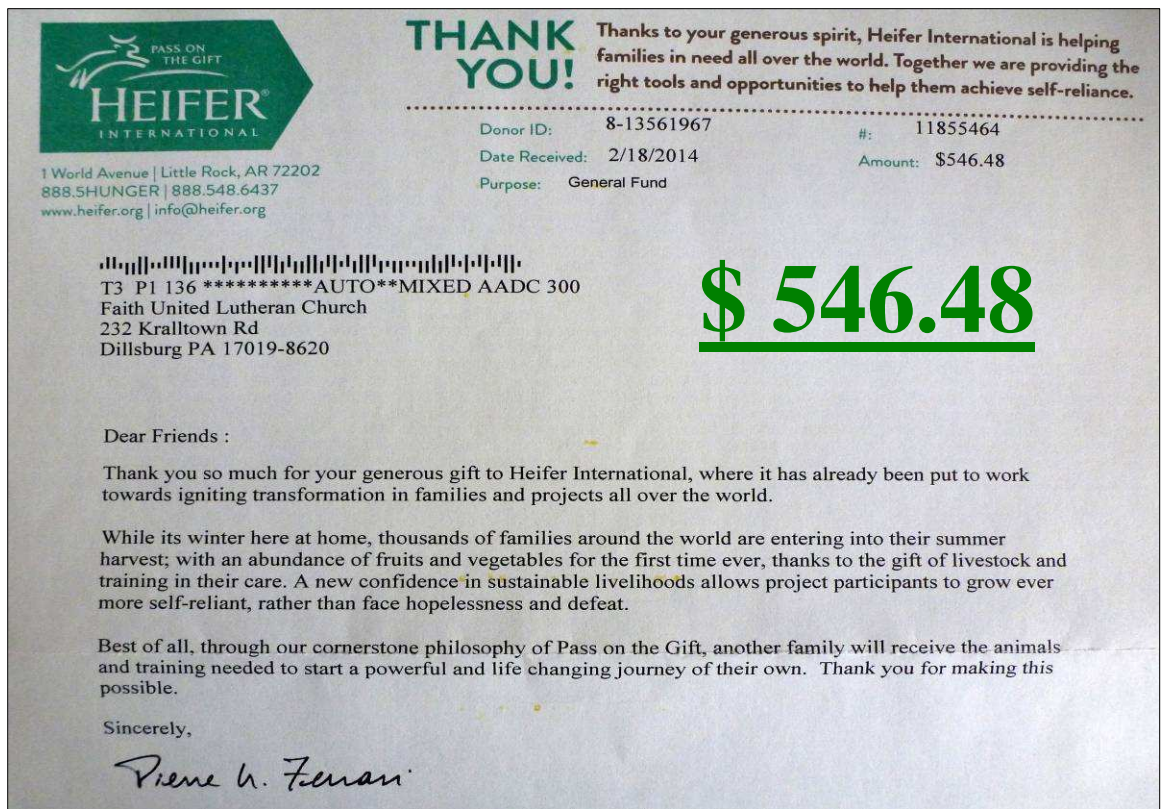
It was a great time of connecting and fellowship. Good food, shared stories, laughter and a little hands-on-labor were but a
