

Message from Pastor Roy

What is your favorite summertime activity? An evening stroll, vacationing with family at the beach or mountain camp, tending a garden, watching fire flies or a thunder storm, feeling the cool of the morning or evening, listening to the songs of birds? The pace of summertime is a bit of a change. but our lifestyles don't really change with the "slower pace of summer," do they? If we are busy, the pace remains busy, if we tend to have more time on our hands than we wish, that often remains true as well.

How can we find a greater sense of rest or peace regardless of how "busy" we are? At times we might think that if we were in the right place, with the right people, doing the right thing, or eating the right food, we would have peace. But like the perfect vacation which often eludes us, we find that whatever the circumstances, we have the same experience of peace. . .or lack thereof.

We all have "drives" and "needs." Often, our first reaction is to try to fulfill these with external stimulation. The Scriptures and saints through the ages remind us that in order to experience fulfillment, we must begin within. They proclaim that a healthy spirituality grows as we release our external dependencies in exchange for inward communion with God (plus ourselves and others) as we plumb the depths of our own souls, guided by the everpresent, ever-willing Spirit. As we heal inwardly, healing flows out from us to others and the rest of creation. *Inner emptiness and brokenness cannot be filled by someone or something outside of us. God meets us inwardly.*

When we feel driven to act compulsively, if we consider that we truly seek inward peace, then we can invite the Spirit to bring her hope-filled quiet. The first step is honesty and humility toward ourselves. The result of this inward journey is communion with neighbor and creation--much more pleasant than when we eat or drink too much or engage in destructive behaviors and habits.

This inward journey has the potential to free us for rest and peace. Such freedom is not the absence of action or conflict or sorrow, but the presence of clarity and awareness of whatever is going on within us or around us as the Spirit draws us along.

Let us heed the inward call of the Spirit to continue this journey. Peace, Pastor Roy

SYNOD ASSEMBLY (AT MESSIAH COLLEGE, JUNE 5-7, 2014)

LUTHERANS PACK 300,000 MEALS TO FEED PENNSYLVANIA'S HUNGRY

"Feeding the Hungry" was not just the theme for our annual Synod Assembly - it was also the service project! Along with a few friends and guests, more than 900 Lower Susquehanna Synod Lutherans packaged more than 300,000 meals destined for dinner plates of our needy neighbors here in central Pennsylvania. The daylong service project provided an exciting kickoff to our annual assembly, which concluded Saturday at Messiah College in Grantham.

Working from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. **June 5**, volunteers packaged 300,324 meals from bulk shipments of rice, beans, vegetable protein, dried vegetables and seasonings. Enough of each ingredient to provide a meal for a family of four was measured and sealed in a plastic bag. The meals are not only nutritionally balanced but also easy to prepare - just pour the contents into boiling water.



"The ELCA is a church that does God's work with our hands," said Bishop James Dunlop, "and this is an opportunity for us to come together and to use our hands to really feed those who hunger in our communities."

To pull off the event, our synod partnered with Thrivent Financial, Messiah College, and End Hunger NE (Outreach, Inc.). A hearty thank-you goes to these three entities for helping with everything from pre-event logistics, support, and resources, to donated space, to clean-up after the event. Rick Baldwin of Thrivent and Matthew Martin of End Hunger NE worked tirelessly before, during, and after the event to ensure that this mammoth undertaking was a success.



The food will be distributed by the Central Pennsylvania Food Bank. Money to pay for the \$75,000 came from congregations and generous contributors (donations are still being accepted).

This hands-on service project provided a positive kickoff to our annual Synod Assembly, which this year focused on how the church feeds people's deepest hungers - not only for food but also for belonging, for love, for community and for spirituality. The gathering of about 1,000 people learned about the many ways Lutherans care for others in nine counties of south central Pennsylvania.

This year Assembly attendees and guests were able to worship and celebrate the ordinations and consecration of five new rostered leaders. Consecrated as a Deaconess was Sister Dottie Almoney (called to St. Peter's, Neffsville). Ordained as pastors were Laura Haupt (called to St. James, Gettysburg), Nancy Knol (called to St. John, Barner's), Ursula Schreffler (called to Zion, Union Deposit), and Ben Siebert (called to Trinity, Arendtsville). David Sensenig (called to Good Shepherd, Liverpool) received orders for training as a Reserve Navy Chaplain and was unable to be present at Assembly. He will be ordained on July 20, at 6:30 p.m. at Christ Lutheran in Linglestown.

After several attempts at trying to get an accurate attendance, it was decided to stop trying any further, stay with 50+ for a count, and sit down and enjoy the food with the rest of the crowd. The strawberries were picked fresh and prepared that very morning, and they were delicious. And the vanilla ice cream was smooth and cold. It rained that evening and that caused the event to be held indoors, but it failed to dampen the fellowship as everyone there had an enjoyable time. Emmanuel would like to extend their appreciation to all that helped to wash, cap, and slice the berries, donated the goodies to share, and cleaned up after the event. This would not have been possible without the combined efforts of many individuals.













BIKE RIDE EVENT/REST STOP AT BARREN'S — On June 14, we again hosted the first rest stop along the 40 mile "Double Creek Tour," cycling event sponsored by the York Health Foundation for the "Healthy Community Pharmacy" which provides medicine and medical supplies to underinsured individuals (who don't qualify for a medical card) in York and Adam's counties. The event this year raised \$50,000 to support families in need at their Healthy Community Pharmacy. Thank you to all who donated food items and drinks for the Double Creek Bike event. You always respond when asked—thanks so much! Especially "thank you" to all the helpers who kept the food and drinks coming. We had 279 bike riders stop at our rest stop at Barren's this year. We had a beautiful day and lots of fun.

THE GARDEN OF HOPE - JUNE 22, 2014 - The garden is doing well. The plants and seeds have responded in fine fashion and we have already taken radishes and onions into New Hope...and there are plenty of both, almost ready again. That along with the other vegetables that are growing nicely gives us high hopes for another bountiful harvest. Now if only we could keep the rabbits from eating the cabbage plants.

MOOC COURSE: SURVEY OF LANDS OF THE BIBLE - Interested in learning more about the Bible and how the land and the history and the practical realities of biblical life go together? "Survey of the Lands of the Bible" the new MOOC course offered by the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg and led by Mark Vitalis Hoffman aims to do just that. The course begins **September 1, 2014 and concludes December 17**.

MOOC stands for "massive, open, online course." The online course uses interactive elements in addition to traditional course materials. "I just love teaching a class where the textbook is mostly maps, graphics, and photographs from biblical history" says The Rev. Dr. Vitalis Hoffman, Professor of Biblical Studies at Gettysburg Seminary. "This course will be the next best thing to actually visiting the Bible lands, and for some of the students, a study trip in January to Israel, Palestine, and Jordan will be just that!"

This is a free, non-credit, online course open to anyone. No homework or reading is required, but those who wish to get the course textbook will be able to read along, join in the discussions, and gain the full benefit of the course. Topics covered will include biblical geography, topology, culture, climate, flora and fauna, travel routes

and archaeology. It will benefit both readers of the Bible and visitors to the biblical lands. It will increase understanding both of the biblical world and of the realities in those lands today. 



<u>LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF</u> - The ELCA has now given 2 million dollars to Lutheran World Relief for the victims of the destruction caused by supertyphoon Haiyan. During that storm last fall, 6,200 people died, 1000 people remain missing, and 1 million people lost their homes. The need for relief will continue well into the future, especially with ongoing storms such as the one which passed through the Philippines recently with 115 mph winds which left at

Old Business:


- Fundraisers: First-aid kits; Bruster's coupon booklets. Keep trying to market these.
