

Message from Pastor Roy

Vacations are our culture's "take" on the Bible's call for sabbath rest. Living in a society in which we are constantly "going" and expected to be productive, it is important to have "down time." 

FIRM FOUNDATION FOR FAITH POURED IN DILLSBURG -Construction began with the pouring of concrete July 9 for the new Christ (Filey) Lutheran Church at 15 S. Filey's Road in Dillsburg. The former church facility was destroyed by fire in August 2010. According to Pastor Debbie Mahady, the congregation hopes to begin worshipping in the new facility by Easter 2013. Thanks be to God!

<u>SUMMER TITHING</u> – Don't take a vacation from church! Even though it is summer vacation time, please remember that the \$\$ needs of your church continue even in your absence.

<u>DO YOU Care-A-TON?</u> - This is a ton of food! The same amount of food New Hope Ministries shares each day to feed hungry families from our area.

If you were to buy this ton of food – that's **2,000 pounds** –it would cost you well over \$1,000 at your local grocery store. If New Hope Ministries bought this ton of food from our friends at the Central Pennsylvania Food Bank, it would cost us only **\$360.**

Summer is always a low time of donations of both food and funds, but the need hasn't gone away. In fact, from April to May of this year, we saw an average **9% increase** in the number of households receiving food through our pantries which has caused our food shelves to be critically low.

Do you **Care-A-TON** about your neighbors who are struggling to feed their families? Your gift will help us meet our goal of purchasing 25 tons of food to make it through the summer period and feed those in our community who turn to New Hope for help. As a client recently expressed with great emotion, "You have been there for me and I would have been lost without you."



From **August 5-19**, each church will be collecting funds with which New Hope Ministries can purchase food from the Central PA food bank. We will be announcing in each church how donations will be received. Please consider giving generously to this effective response to hunger in our area. Also, remember to give extra garden produce to New Hope as well—easily delivered to their office on 2nd Street in Dillsburg across from the Senior Center!



TRAVEL THE WORLD...AND NEVER LEAVE HOME - SHARE! Northeast is looking for volunteer host families for foreign students who would like to learn first-hand about the American Way of Life. Teens from Europe, Asia, Central and South America will arrive in **August** to study for a semester or academic year at local high schools. Host families are asked to provide room and board as well as friendship, understanding, and a willingness to share this unique experience with their chosen student. Students are between the ages of 15 and 18, speak English, are covered by medical insurance, and have adequate spending money for their own personal expenses. Families are able to review student applications and select the student they feel will best match the interests of their family. SHARE! provides support during the entire experience through the network of dedicated Local Exchange Program Coordinators. The SHARE! Program, sponsored



Director of Evangelical Mission Named

Bishop B. Penrose Hoover is pleased to announce that the **Reverend Richard Jorgensen** has agreed to serve as the new Director of Evangelical Mission (DEM) for the Lower Susquehanna Synod, ELCA. He fills the position vacated by the Rev. David Fisher, who will retire on August 31, 2012.

Currently serving as pastor at Holy Spirit Lutheran Church, Lancaster, Pastor Jorgensen has received ELCA Mission Developer training and has participated in workshops and training events for transformational ministry. Previously he served as associate pastor at St. Matthew, York, and as pastor at St. Paul, Hametown; Christ (Filey Pastoral Charge), Dillsburg; and Zion, Waynesboro, Virginia. Pastor Jorgensen was ordained on June 8, 1989, by the Metropolitan New York Synod at St. Agnes, Rockville Center, New York.

Jorgensen graduated from the State University of New York at Binghamton in 1984 with a B.A. in Political Science. He received his Master of Divinity degree from the

Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg in 1989 and earned a Master of Science in Pastoral Care and Counseling from Neumann College in 2005.

He is married to the Reverend Janice Covner Jorgensen who serves as associate pastor at Zion Lutheran Church, York. They are parents to Mark (20) and Leah (15).

Pastor Jorgensen will begin his service as Director of Evangelical Mission in the Lower Susquehanna Synod on August 23, 2012.

"<u>NURTURING WITH NATURE</u>"

Hello and welcome to "Nurturing with Nature," a new FULP newsletter column devoted to nurturing the curiosity and wonder for our natural world that resides in each of us, especially our children. Did you know that a child's brain development is directly influenced by the experiences it has in the pre-school years? Are you aware that being outdoors in nature promotes healthy brain development and social awareness in young children? These early connections have an enormous impact on a child's behavior, social skills, and emotional development.

Each "Nurturing with Nature" article will include one or two nature activities to do with a child; a "Let's Do More" suggestion; and corresponding insights as to why the activity is important to a developing brain. While each activity will be written from a child's perspective, the activities are not restricted to young children. Each activity will offer the opportunity for everyone to explore our natural world easily and in a unique manner. No special education or expensive equipment required; the only prerequisite is openness toward discovery and fun. So, ready to get started???



Activity: Take me outdoors as often as you can. Help me notice all the little differences we can see, feel, and smell as the seasons and weather change. Help me to use my gift of imagination.

Let's Do More: Take an *Opposite Hike*. Help me find something hard/soft, quiet/loud, stinky/fragrant using my senses. You explore too, and we can share what we've found together.

Why this is important: .Activities done outdoors, in a relaxed setting, offer bonding opportunities and engage us in God's creating and re-creating character. It provides opportunity to talk about God in simple and non-complex ways. Being outdoors is naturally a multi-sensory experience. The brain learns and retains more when many senses are used. These kinds of activities help the brain, *at any age*, develop and retain memory

Yard Flamingo Fundraiser IT'S TIME TO THINK PINK!



The Flamingo Flocking season is here. 


