Message from Pastor Roy

Advent is a season of wonder and new beginnings. It is a journey into wonderment. It is a chance to reconsider what being a "Christian" is all about. This Jesus—who is he and to what does he call us? Does he and his Father have exceedingly high expectations? Or is Jesus simply calling us to live well and be well both personally and as a community?

How do we get to this place of being well and care for neighbor? How do we learn from our wonderworking masterteacher-friend? This one who did so much for so many--helping, teaching, challenging crowds to ponder, yes, to wonder, to keep scratching beneath the surface of what it means to live and love.

This Advent, let us listen to what Jesus says. . .and listen to what we are saying about Jesus. What does it all mean-that Jesus came to earth. . .that he is coming again? Why these candles? Why so busy? Why are we lonely, missing something, or waiting for something just beyond our reach? Some suggest that only in our incompleteness, our longing, and our suffering-only there can we truly meet God. When we stop struggling, we stop living and loving. Lots of wonderment there!

This Advent, give it all some thought. When you find yourself feeling blue, look for God. When you feel lost and weary, press on with wonder...into God's presence. Prepare to be surprised. It probably won't be what you are expecting. If shallow answers have you down, be filled with wonder about that...and press on into the depths of mercy and peace. The uncomfortable reality is that peace is not the elimination of struggle, but the acceptance, with grace, of it.

Each year, Advent can teach us that we are not called to reach unattainable heights, but to wait in the faithful place of the meandering thoughts and wonderments of our hearts and souls. Push on, stretch on, struggle on. . .into the wonderment of love. Find it in the stranger, your neighbor, your family, in the very Spirit of God who dwells, not in the heights, especially, but in the valleys—in the losses, disappointments, misunderstandings, and wonderments of our lives and society.

All we need for the journey is within our grasp. Thanks be to God for this journey of faithful wonder.

BISHOP JAMES S. DUNLOP INSTALLED SEPTEMBER 28, 2013 IN YORK





Saturday, **September 28**, was a day filled with anticipation, joy, laughter, and celebration, but most of all it was a time of thanksgiving and worship as ELCA Presiding Bishop Mark Hanson installed The Reverend James S. Dunlop as Bishop of our Lower Susquehanna Synod. Hundreds of family, friends, rostered leaders, bishops, and ecumenical representatives filled the pews of the cavernous sanctuary of St. Matthew Lutheran Church in York for the service of Holy Eucharist that included a stirring message from Bishop Hanson.



"Do not fear," said Bishop Hanson, addressing Bishop Dunlop. "There are the three most important words in your ministry." Urging all the baptized to remember their call to share the good news, Bishop Hanson asked all who had them to turn on their cell phones and call or text someone to tell them the good news and that Jesus loves them. "Our baptismal calling is to serve all people," the Presiding Bishop stressed.

"O, Bishop Dunlop, be a midwife for the gospel. Remind people of what they already know, encourage them," he added. "I pray for the anointing of all of you."







Friends and family of Bishop Dunlop also took part in the service as cantor, lectors, communion assistants, and flagon bearers. Retired Lower Susquehanna Synod Bishop B. Penrose Hoover served as Gospeller, and Presiding Bishop Mark Hanson preached. Twelve bishops participated in the laying on of hands, and the congregation was invited to lay hands on one another and offer a blessing.

Following worship, those present were invited to continue the celebration at a reception sponsored by Lutheran Social Services of South Central Pennsylvania and coordinated by Sodexo Food Services. The invitations and worship booklets were made possible through generous financial support by Thrivent Financial. The congregation of St. Matthew worked tirelessly to make the event run smoothly, and many other volunteers gave significant amounts of time and talent to this effort.

Words from the third verse of the sending hymn, "Praise to the Lord, the Almighty," provide a fitting reminder for our Lower Susquehanna Synod as we continue this journey under the guidance and leadership of Bishop Dunlop:

"Praise to the Lord; who will prosper your work and defend you;/surely his goodness and mercy shall daily attend you. Ponder anew what the Almighty can do/if with his love he befriend you."

May God be ever with us as we go out to serve and feed others as Christ has fed us. To watch the service in its entirety, see the synod's website.

A LETTER OF GRATITUDE FROM BISHOP HANSON

Dear Colleagues in Ministry,



With gratitude for God's amazing grace, your ministries and our partnership in the gospel, I conclude my ministry as ELCA presiding bishop. I thank God for your prayers that have sustained me and continue to undergird the ministries to which God has called us.

These have been 12 years of phenomenal changes in the religious landscape of the world, the church, our capacity to communicate, and our increasingly pluralistic society. With change often comes anxiety, sometimes nostalgia and increased tension, but always the opportunity to proclaim and trust the good news that we are justified by God's grace through faith. This is all on account of Christ, crucified and risen for all.

I can think of no better time to be a Lutheran Christian than now. In a culture weary from political gridlock and divisive rhetoric, we have good news to share – God has reconciled the whole creation in Christ. This is God's doing, not ours. God entrusts this message and ministry of reconciliation to us.

When so many feel excluded for what they lack and who they are not, we have good news to share – you are a beloved child of God, created in God's image. God is not in the sin-accounting business. You are forgiven.

When there is pressure in a competitive, consumer-driven, religious marketplace to define our ministries on the basis of what sets us apart, in Christ we find ourselves defined on the basis of our relatedness to others. Yes, Christ unites diverse people and gifts in one body, and this unity is God's gift in the church and creation.

Among the questions that draw us into conversation is this one: How do we share this wellspring of God's grace in Christ in a culture suspicious of doctrine, disengaged from institutions, distrustful of leaders, and increasingly pluralistic?

As Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton begins her call, I join in thanking God for her many gifts for leadership, and I pray that the Holy Spirit will give her great joy in this marvelous call.

From the gospel reading for Reformation Day, we hear these words from Jesus, "If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples; and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free. . . so if the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed" (John 8:31-32, 36).

In all of our endings and beginnings may we continue to abide in this Word, Jesus Christ, who is the way, the truth and the life.

It has been a great blessing to have served with you as partners in the gospel. I will continue to pray, with joy, thanksgiving and confidence, that the good work begun among us God will bring to completion in Jesus Christ (Philippians 1:3-6). In God's grace,

<u>DAY OF GRATITUDE - OCTOBER 6, 2013</u> - On Sunday, October 6th, the citizens of Dillsburg and surrounding communities joined together at Northern High School's Bostic Field to celebrate and offer thanksgiving to all who offer their time and talents, and sometimes their lives, as Fire/Rescue and Law Enforcement workers and volunteers.



The gathering offered an intimate setting for many to share detailed stories of events in their lives when the efforts of those responding to their call for help made a marked and long-lasting impression. While not all the stories had the desired and hoped-for ending, the sense of gratitude toward the groups and individuals who put forth the valiant effort to make a difference was felt by all who heard the stories. While the main purpose of the day was to show appreciation for those who serve the local communities, it was also a time to become acquainted with the organizations, the equipment they use, and the folks dedicated to making it all work. Representatives of the organizations were on hand and very eager to share their knowledge, experiences and expertise. <u>BLESSING OF THE ANIMALS (OCTOBER 13, 2013)</u> – St. Francis of Assisi once said, "A single sunbeam is enough to drive away many shadows." That was certainly the case when folks, and their very diverse animal companions, gathered on Sunday, October 13th at Emmanuel for the Parish's annual "Blessing of the Animals" service, to commemorate the Feast of St. Francis; a reminder of God's love of all beings.

Although the sky was sullen with gray clouds and the air held a chilly bite, there was a warmth that occurs whenever love gathers. Prayers, song, and reflections were offered by those assembled in gratitude for the companionship, bonds of love, life lessons, and general enrichment of life we receive from the animals with whom we share the world and our lives.



It was evident that God's redeeming love is not confined by species or breed, but has the power to bring light into dark places, remove boundaries and build bridges.

In order to help lessen the boundaries of loneliness and uncertainty for homeless canines, the service's offering (\$100.00) was donated to Canine Rescue of Central Pa., www.crcpa.org. Located just outside of Dillsburg, Canine Rescue of Central Pa, Inc. is a 501c (3) nonprofit organization. Canine Rescue is an all-volunteer group dedicated to providing assistance to any dog in a helpless situation. It is estimated that 5-7 million companion animals enter shelters each year; approximately 3-4 million of those are euthanized. The volunteers at Canine Rescue work selflessly to lessen canine suffering and find them loving and lifetime homes. New volunteers are always welcome and very appreciated.


