
Message from Pastor Roy

As a child, my best friends and good neighbors were Roman Catholics. I am sure I am not alone in this, but despite my good experiences, I held a level of suspicion toward Roman Catholics and their Church. Fortunately, my education, experiences, and the Spirit clunking me over the head with the Scriptures have helped me to see the true unity of the church which is not undermined by church political traditions and structures.

Might it be that our outright and subconscious misgivings about the Roman Catholic Church cause us to assume that we are confessing loyalty to the Roman Catholic Church when we recite the creedal phrase, "I believe in the holy, catholic church?" Perhaps Protestant suspicions of the Roman Church persist today more than between Protestant denominations because the Roman Church understands itself as the true representation of the church. Further, it understands the Pope, its spiritual head, to be the supreme authority for the whole church.

Here is a little history on the Roman Catholic Church and its divide from the Orthodox Church. The Roman Church is one of the ancient, original, regional churches. These

ancient, "Orthodox," churches view one another, and their patriarchs, as equals. Beginning in the fourth century after the Nicene Creed was confirmed by a council of the whole ("catholic") church, a disagreement arose between the western church (Rome) and the Orthodox churches culminating in a meeting in AD 1054 between the Pope and the representative patriarch of the other churches who simultaneously excommunicated one another, walked away, and never "came back." The church was officially and effectively split, and the divide remains to this day. The Eastern Church and the Roman Church both have their expectations concerning how reunification could occur, but the main sticking point is Rome's tradition of its own unique authority (based on their interpretation of the conversation between Jesus and Peter, being the first head bishop of Rome-- "You are Peter and upon this rock I will build my church. . . ") and the rest of the church's unwillingness to accept that interpretation. In my opinion, the conflict reveals the brokenness of humanity even as we seek to be humble and open to the Spirit of God. Unholy pride and mistrust easily arise in our traditions and institutions and result in

division and loss of fellowship.

The question thus arises frequently, "Why do we use the word "catholic" rather than "Christian" (as we used to!) when we recite the creeds?" The original Greek in the creed uses the word kath" (according to) "holos" (the whole) cath holos/catholic. The whole creed and church is Christian, but "Christian" does not in any way translate the original intention of this line in the creed. As the Roman Catholic population began to grow in



the United States, people began to assume that "holy, catholic church" referred not to the entire church of Jesus Christ, but specifically to the Roman Catholic Church. Wanting to avoid confusion and not wishing to appear to confess allegiance to a Church to which they did not belong, they substituted the general word "Christian" for the specific word "catholic." As the American creedal (non-Roman Catholic) churches began to take stock of their liturgical heritage and began in the '70s to bring their worship more into alignment with the ancient traditions of the church, they also encouraged a return to the original wording of the line "holy, catholic church." Again, little "c" catholic does not refer to a specific part of the church, but to the universality of the church, the "holos"--whole--church. This part of the creed reminds us that

we are globally "one" regardless of our tribal tendencies to divide and assume the worst about "those people" we don't know well.

It might not feel that we are one, but according to the Gospel of Jesus Christ, we are. We are one church united in the love and mercy of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. Thus, let us boldly confess that unity every week when we say "I believe in (One--Nicene) the holy, catholic church." Lutherans, Roman Catholics, Presbyterians, Methodists, Reformed, Baptist, Mennonite, Brethren, and all are One. Thanks be to God for the unity of love which knows no limits!

From Tiny Seeds to Abundant Harvest

The crisp winds of October are ushering in cool Autumn rains and blowing the colorful leaves from the trees. Across our synod congregations are finishing up the harvest from their community gardens and putting the beds and fields to rest for the winter. Gardeners from Barren's and Emmanuel Lutheran Churches, two of the three congregations that comprise Faith United Parish in Dillsburg, once again donated hundreds of pounds of fresh produce



from their "Garden of Hope" to New Hope Ministries, ensuring that local residents dealing with food insecurity have spinach, radishes, cabbage, onions, beets, beans, turnips, corn, melons, and other fresh vegetables on their plates.

"A neat thing about the Garden of Hope is that it is dependent on folks from both Emmanuel and Barren's, a truly joint effort," said Pastor Roy Stetler. The garden began when Emmanuel church member Loren Swivel was riding her horse down the farm lane and decided that there was plenty of room along the border of one of the fields to plant a garden instead of watching weeds grow.

"Since we started in 2009, we have given New Hope Ministries about 3380 pounds of fresh vegetables," said Swivel. "We received a grant of \$600.00 from our synod to get started, but since then we have donated the plants and seeds or received some donations from a local business and our high school agriculture department.

"Almost anyone can start a community garden," added Swivel. "and I'd be happy to help congregations get going with a project."




