Message from Pastor Roy

We are a month into 2015. (Is there no slowing time?) By now most well-intentioned resolutions have been set aside. There are many reasons we give up on our attempts to form better habits. Sometimes we give up because the effort becomes a burden and we lose sight of the value of our goals. Recently I came across a list of five challenging practices which are a path toward a stronger and wiser spirit. If we allow our spirits to be led by God's Spirit in these practices, the result is lifegiving and hope-filled. Rather than mandates, I find these inviting, rest-filled challenges. Rather than being someone else's prescription for change or success, these are very much driven by what the Spirit is already doing within us. These come from Richard Rohr's, "Daily Meditation," Monday, December 29th, 2014.

Contemplative practice: Contemplation is a "laboratory" in which you learn to die and to be reborn. The rest of your life becomes the field in which you live out this way of surrender and participation in Love. Commit to a daily practice of some kind--silent meditation. yoga...

Sabbath: Set aside regular,


longer periods of quiet or retreat, simply to rest in awareness of God's presence. Find a rhythm of rest and work that allows for renewal so that you enter your active life from contemplative grounding.

Service: Allow the natural welling-up of love to flow outward in acts of justice, healing, and compassion. Life is not about you; you are about life!

Shadow work: The task of searching out and embracing shadow--the parts of yourself that you hide or ignore--is ongoing, the work of a lifetime. Let the people and circumstances that "push your buttons" be your teachers. Look for yourself with a loving gaze in the mirror of both your enemies and those who enthrall you.

Spiritual direction: If you do not have someone to guide you, to hold onto you during the times of not knowing, you will normally stay at your present level of growth. Seek out a sacred companion you can trust to be honest and present to your journey, who can reflect back to you God's presence in your life and the world.

ASH WEDNESDAY




SPAGHETTI SUPPER

ANGLICAN BOOK OF COMMON PRAYERS AND READINGS

Here (on next page) are a set of devotional readings which follow the rhythm of the day. Regular use of these focuses our attention Godward and instills a sense of prayer throughout the day. The prayers are well used from centuries past. One's own choice of scripture readings or other meditative reflections may be used in the "reading" segment of each. Rather than being an obligation, these are an invitation to sense the Spirit moving with us through our days. This year, part of my Lenten "practice" will be to use these "devotions" throughout the day. They are found on pages 136-140 of the Anglican Book of Common Prayer, an excellent source of readings and prayers.

A period of silence may follow.
A hymn or canticle may be used; the Apostles' Creed may be said.

Amen.

In the Early Evening

This devotion may be used before or after the evening meal.

O gracious light, pure brightness of the everliving Father in heaven, O Jesus Christ, holy and blessed! Now as we come to the setting of the sun, and our eyes behold the vesper light, we sing your praises, O God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. You are worthy at all times to be praised by happy voices, O Son of God, O Giver of Life, and to be glorified through all the worlds.

A Reading. . .It is not ourselves that we proclaim; we proclaim Christ Jesus as Lord, and ourselves as your servants, for Jesus' sake. For the same God who said, "Out of darkness let light shine," has caused his light to shine within us, to give the light of revelation—the revelation of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. 2 Corinthians 4:5-6

Prayers may be offered for ourselves and others.

The Collect. . .Lord Jesus, stay with us, for evening is at hand and the day is past; be our companion in the way, kindle our hearts, and awaken hope, that we may know you as you are revealed in Scripture and the breaking of bread. Grant this for the sake of your love. *Amen.*


