Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

By now, I'm sure you have heard that beginning February 6th, CLC Filey's and Barren's will be sharing worship at Barren's at 10:30 on Sunday mornings. This idea is only in its "experimental" phase. Nothing that happens between CLC Filey's and Barren's is set in stone, but it is an idea worth trying. Their joint worship will give all of the churches in the parish the opportunity to think about our worship practices and may lead us to change a few things about worship. There will be a very special parish council meeting that everyone is invited to attend on **Tuesday, February 1st at 7:30pm at Emmanuel** to discuss the worship changes that will be taking place at Barren's and how those changes will impact Emmanuel, St. John's Franklin, and the parish as a whole. This will be a conversation mainly focused on "the Barren's and CLC Filey's worship experiment" in the life of the parish, but there may be other issues that come up that we can address at that time. After Easter, we will have another similar meeting to discuss how we felt about the "worship experiment" and where we go from there.

I know that changing even the smallest things in worship can lead people to feel like *everything in the church is changing*. Part of me wants to tell you that is not true, but that would be a lie. Life is all about change. We are people who live and breathe and grow and get older *every day*, and so, we are a people that *change* everyday. The Church is filled with people who live and breathe and change, therefore, it is an entity that lives and breathes and changes. Whether we realize it or not, the Church is always changing. When we long for "the way things were" or "how it used to be" we are, in a way, holding the Church back from changing, not because it's good for the people of God and not because it's good for the sharing of the Gospel, but because, selfishly, we don't like change.

I think it's time for us as a parish, to admit that times are changing. It's time for us to confront the fear and anxiety that comes with change. It's time for us to start sharing some of our hurts and grief that naturally come with change. There will be many opportunities in the coming months for conversations as a parish and as individual congregations to talk with your council leadership and your pastors about the changes in our lives. Your council presidents and your pastors have already met to discuss matters of change and we are doing our best to communicate with each other and with you so that everyone has the same information about what is going on.

In the next few months during "the Barren's and CLC Filey's worship experiment" different people of the parish and Filey's are bound to feel differently about these changes. Some people may begin to see the possibilities of a future church that includes all the congregations of the parish and CLC Filey's and some people will probably feel very much the opposite of that view of the future. At one point or another, we are all going to share our views; with our families or in larger group settings or maybe even with members from other churches. I ask that you please be gentle with one another. Please be careful with how you express your hopes or your fears. Please be kind to those that don't share your view of the future.

I want you to know that nothing has been finalized. Any decisions about our future together as a parish will be made only after many, many conversations and many, many prayers and then some more conversations.

Change is difficult and scary stuff. Pastor Roy and I want to hear your concerns and your hopes. Please don't hesitate to get in touch with one of us or your council presidents especially if you or someone you know is having difficulty with these changes.

The future has never actually been certain, but in times of change, the future can seem much less certain. The thing that we can be certain about is that God is holding us, Jesus is with us, and the Spirit is guiding us through whatever the future may bring.

HOMEBOUND MINISTRY - Please consider joining in our ministry with the homebound. I (Pastor Roy) will be scheduling an informational training meeting at the convenience of those interested. This is an enjoyable ministry for anyone who would like to visit one or more of our older members. Receiving communion is a tangible experience of sharing in our worship from Sunday morning. Anyone who is willing to take the time to visit is able to lead this simple liturgy which is similar to the liturgy of Holy Communion led by a pastor. The main difference is that the elements are blessed during the service on Sunday morning and then taken by the volunteer who remembers with the homebound member what was said during the previous liturgy and offers the bread and wine. I will work with you to find an individual with whom you are comfortable. I can come along for the first visit to introduce you, if that is helpful. The simple liturgy can be altered according to the needs of the homebound member. Once a month, or even once a quarter, would be such an encouragement for the homebound. All it takes is a little time. Please talk to me if you would like to volunteer in this way. Visits mean so much to the homebound and they lift the spirits of the visitor too!

The best way to get to know people is to have conversations with them and a really good time to have conversations is over a good meal. Much like "Dinner For Six," our "Dinner With New Friends" will match three or four couples/families/individuals together who will share several meals together. Each house-hold will take a turn being the host and will provide a main course and beverages, everyone else that comes to dinner will bring side-dishes and desert (you will have to communicate with your "New Friends" to plan dates that will work and who will bring

what dish to share). Each group of "New Friends" will share three to four dinners together over the next several months. (If you do not wish to host in your home, you may host at one of our Parish congregations, please check church schedules first). Look for sign-up sheets in your Churches soon. 


