Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The peace and quiet that follows the annual buildup to Christmas is our chance to be mindful of God's love and mercy. God loves us with Christmas. God's embrace comes in the birth of the one who would become such a powerful God-presence to those who heard his teaching and felt his healing touch. To know this God Present we must make room for him. As you know, Christ's presence does not overwhelm us. We must choose to follow him. We choose to nurture the gift of the Spirit within us. We choose to become friends with silence—to know God in prayer. We know Christ in prayer—listening for, receiving, and then sharing the mystery of peace. Mary knew the latter, much more than the former.

In the birth of Christ, God loves us by becoming one of us. In all the chances and changes of our lives and in our churches, let us celebrate that fact this Christmas. In our moments of waiting and worshiping as Mary did, we accomplish that for which God has called us. Let that be the foundation for everything we are, and say, and do.

Soul-sustaining Christmas (God with us) and Epiphany (God revealed among us) seasons to you all.

BULLETIN NEWS - Yes, our worship bulletins have changed, very slightly. In your bulletins you will now notice that the intros/explanations to the readings have been removed; this is because many times they are not theologically sound, there is a lack of consistency with our Lectors in that some people say them and some people don't, and taking them out will save space (though minimal) in the bulletin and time in the service. You will also notice that the words to the Eucharistic Prayer (Prayer of Thanksgiving) are no longer printed; this is because your pastors would like a little more freedom in the prayers that they use during that important part of Communion. Last, but not least, hopefully you've noticed the inserts that have been added; these inserts (by Vibrant Faith Ministries) provide a way for everyone to take worship home with them, either by using the daily readings in your personal/family devotions, by using the prayers/blessing for meals, or by using the activities to connect with family, friends, and the community. <u>DINING WITH NEW FRIENDS</u> - We are continuing to get to know our CLC Filey's brothers and sisters in various ways. THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM MINISTRY OF THE LOWER SUSQUEHANNA SYNOD needs YOU!

The CJS Ministry of our synod is a new ministry, but it is growing. This synodical ministry team continues to inspire congregations to TOSS, Take One Small Step in ministering to someone in the Criminal Justice System which includes those in prison and also their families, especially the children of people who are incarcerated. However, the Criminal Justice System also includes police, correctional officers, wardens, probation officers, judges, and their families. The CJS Ministry team focuses on all of those involved in the system. Who do you know that is connected in some way to the Criminal Justice System? Who do you know in the CJS that could use prayer and support? One small step the Parish can take would be to collect Bibles for inmates in our local prisons (there is an enormous need for Bibles). DO one of you feel moved to take up this cause and collect Bibles? If you would like more information on this growing ministry in our Synod, please contact Pastor Naomi.


2011 ENVELOPES/DUTIES LISTS

Non-council members in attendance: Gail Stetler, Kevin Hoke, and Jack McCauslin. Meeting began with a discussion between CLC Filey's and Barren's members regarding having joint worship services. Pending discussion by CLC Filey's, we will be worshipping together with Sunday School at 9:15 and worship at 10:30, with communion every Sunday.

Approval of November Minutes – Amber Shearer – correction to last month's minutes: the minutes approved at last month's meeting were October's minutes; Bob & Kay Fest helped Bob & Linda Gochenauer with pictures and creating a written inventory of everything in the church; motion by Linda, 2nd Marcy. **Comptroller Report** – Amber Shearer – November income, \$5,744.78, expenses, \$4,258.62, net income, \$1,486.16, report showed a \$1.00 amount for electric; Amber will check what happened; report tabled until next month. **Treasurer's Report** – Carl Shearer – Had to transfer \$10,000 from money market CD to checking account; received a check from CLC Filey's for 4 months rent, will be receiving monthly checks now. **Pastors' Report** – on file.

Committee Reports

Property – Carl Shearer – more light bulbs were replaced; furnace problems in the church house were fixed; got a new pump for the well; septic tanks were cleaned; tanks were under the black top by the road and under the cement by the church house; Tom Rupp and Bob Gochenauer replaced some loose shingles on the church house roof.

- Coffee with God will still be the 2nd Sunday of each month; sign-up sheet will be at the back of the church.
- Task Force for Savings is working.
- We further discussed church house policies.

New Business

- Carl talked to another representative from a different bank about direct deposit; he will try to have them come to one of our future meetings.
- There will not be a poinsettia tree next year if there are not enough orders in to Ellen by the deadline; suggestions for a new type of stand that would not take as many plants for next year.
- Fundraisers and other things we can do will be discussed at the next council meeting.
- Pastor Roy presented: using the CLC Filey's rent money to give an \$800 scholarship to a student in Tanzania which will cover tuition and minimal amount of living expenses; motion made by Ellen, 2nd Clint.
