

<u>PULPIT EXCHANGE</u> - Pastor Lois of St. Paul's, Pastor Debbie of Filey's, and I have proposed to our councils (who responded favorably) a pulpit exchange in which we preach and preside in one another's churches once a quarter. This will help us to become more familiar with the Lutheran congregations in Dillsburg and provide a bit of variety in pastoral leadership during worship. As pastors we are called by a congregation to primarily serve that (those) congregation(s). However, our call also extends to the church at large as opportunity allows. If a pastor becomes ill, or if there is a pastoral transition and an interim is not in place, it is helpful when other local Lutheran pastors can help out with hospital/shut-in visitations and officiating at funerals. If the pastors are worshipping with each of the neighbor congregations twice a year, then we are better prepared to do this and the congregation is not left feeling quite so "alone" in a pastoral "crisis."

When pastors go on vacations, we line up coverage in case there is an emergency. I have provided this coverage for a number of pastors in our conference. During my vacation in July Pastor Debbie visited a parish member in the hospital and they both thoroughly enjoyed the visit. She also led worship that week. Unfortunately, it is not possible to have the other pastors preach and preside at St. John's quarterly; but if Franklin wishes to join the other churches on those Sundays, that would be fine--especially after we have the chance to plan further in advance. The first exchange will be on October 7th (World Communion Sunday!) with Pastor Lois Van Orden preaching and presiding at Emmanuel and Barren's. The next exchange will probably be late February--after Filey's moves into their new building.

- How can we claim a Lutheran identity in a changing world?
- What is God calling all of us to be and do in the future as church together?

The Year of ReFORMation, beginning with the Bishop's Convocation for rostered and lay leaders:

- Provides **14 listening posts** on the territory of this synod for synod leadership to hear your thoughts and prayers about the core questions; (see below)
- Leads into two conference assemblies, January April, where more conversation will happen;
- Prepares us for the election of a bishop in June;
- Facilitates continuing conversation through an online blog; and more!



Christ the King Sunday – Nov. 25, 2012



This King's death and resurrection show us the extent of his reign which has no limits and no end. Thanks be to God for our gracious King!


Christ the King Puzzle Can you find the way to King Jesus?



- The church organ's power supply was struck by lightening and parts have been ordered. After installation a determination for further damage can be made and an insurance claim submitted.


