Roy Stetler and Naomi Sease Carriker, Pastors Faith United Lutheran Parish

I always look forward to this time of the year since the heat of the day almost always cools for the evening. The wide range of seasons, creatures and plants we see around us are a constant reminder of God's goodness. Here is the spring from which flows eternal hope and courage to live boldly in the grace of God today. The traditions and language of our faith allow us to encourage one another.

Jesus grew up with the Jewish faith of his people. He learned of God's amazing mercy and peace likely at the synagogue in Nazareth and in the laps of his parents. His was a God who cared more for creation than our wildest imaginations could provide. He came to teach of a God who was incapable of disappointing. Even in the most difficult of life's challenges and frustrations, even with the threat of death, Jesus knew that he and the trust of his friends were safe in the care of such a good God. Beyond the seeming limits of his life, he knew of resurrection which ultimately and finally would never disappoint. He pressed on in faithfulness to God and all of creation.

Such faith and hope give us courage. His willingness to die for the cause of the least in his society, his willingness to die for the integrity of his teachings is why we call him Savior of the world. In Christian Theology, Christ is the second member of the Triune God: Co-partners with God the creator-father, and God the Spirit. That is quite a statement! We sometimes take it for granted because most of us grew up believing that Jesus is God.

If we are to say, that Jesus is God, it is important to know why we say Jesus is God and how we believe Jesus is God. Everything we believe is a matter of dialogue among friends—our beliefs are points of conversation so that we can explore the spiritual realities of our world. There are many churches and Christians who proclaim doctrines of the Christian Church as absolutes which may not be questioned. I believe this forces some to pretend they believe truths which they do not actually believe and to stop asking questions such as “What does this mean?” and “Why do I believe it?”

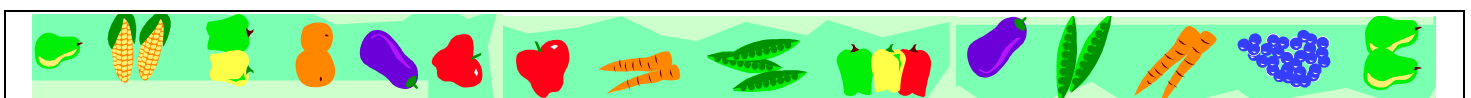
We have neighbors who are asking these questions. Other neighbors will not be able to ask and answer these questions until we show them the love of God in tangible ways—until we take the time and energy to listen to them and care for them.

Let us continue to gather to hear the Word, to break bread and share the cup of our Lord's life and living presence. The table of communion is one way we weekly celebrate our Lord's tangible presence among us. We meet each other face to face. In that meeting our Lord comes alive and welcomes us as friends. What can we do on Sunday morning that could be regularly more important than being filled with Christ's love as we hear the word and partake of his body and blood. Lutherans believe these are not symbols but the actual presence of our Lord Jesus Christ. This “ritual” forms us spiritually and physically as the people of Jesus. The courage of our Lord to live and die for love is what we long to be as well. Let us boldly take part in this holy exchange with our ears and our mouths.

Thanks be to God for the faithfulness and love of Jesus Christ. May we ever anticipate meeting him, learning from him, and receiving him.




PARISH NEWS

Dear Pastor Naomi Sease Carriker,

It is with our deepest regret that we must ask for your resignation from Faith United Lutheran Parish. Due to the financial issues facing all three churches in the Parish it is now clear that we will no longer be able to support the one and three-quarters ministers that we currently employ. Upon consulting with the bishop's office and with much prayer and contemplation, we believe this is the best solution to some of the issues facing our parish.

With your approval, the last day of your call will be Sunday October 2, 2011. Vacation and the proposed severance package will carry until January 15th, 2012.

Draft Severance Agreement

With your approval, the last day of your call will be Sunday October 2, 2011. At this point Faith United Lutheran Parish will reimburse you for three weeks of paid vacation time owed to you. This will continue until October 23rd, 2011. At this point a three month severance agreement will begin and carry until January 15th, 2012.


If you begin a new full-time call or full-time employment before January 15th, 2012, all payments would be made until the effective date of the new call or the commencement of new employment. Any compensation you would receive from part-time ecclesiastical or secular work during the period of October 24, 2011 through January 15, 2012, will not be deducted from the amount of the severance payments.

We will need you to complete all work with the parish by Sunday October 2nd 2011. You will also need to remove any personal belongings from the churches of the Parish and turn over all keys to the congregations and any other property of the churches in your possession to the parish council president by October 2nd, 2011. You should do no pastoral act nor fulfill any pastoral responsibility for any member of Faith United Lutheran Parish after October 2nd, 2011 unless invited by Pastor Roy Stetler. You will also need to provide the parish council president with a letter of resignation effective October 23rd, 2011 as one of the called pastors of Faith United Lutheran Parish.

TRANSITIONAL MATTERS - Beginning in the month of September, you will notice some more significant transitions in the life of the parish. We will worship together outdoors at Emmanuel on September 4 (Labor Day weekend) at 9:00AM. Sunday, September 11 & 18, Pastor Roy will be leading worship at Emmanuel at 9:00AM and then lead worship at Barren's at 10:30AM - this will be the new worship schedule for non-parish worship Sundays. Pastor Naomi will be modeling the lay-led worship at St. John's Franklin September 11 & 18. We will all join together for parish worship on Sunday, September 25 at Barren's at 10:30AM for the ABC Crew Celebration worship and then again the following Sunday (October 2nd) at Emmanuel at 9:00AM for Pastor Naomi's last Sunday.

Please continue to remember our parish and Pastor Naomi in your prayers as we journey in this time of transition toward closure of her ministry among us as a regularly called pastor. I (Pastor Roy) am appreciative of her help in these past months to be as well organized and prepared as possible for her departure. I also appreciate her willingness to attend the national ELCA assembly on behalf of our synod.

CHURCHWIDE ASSEMBLY – by Pastor Naomi

The 12th biennial Church Wide Assembly of the ELCA was held August 15-19 at the Orlando World Center Marriott. The theme was "Freed in Christ to serve." I attended as one of the voting members from the Lower Susquehanna Synod. The days were long and full - from the time we arrived early Sunday evening until we caught the shuttle back to the airport on Friday mid-morning, we were busy in plenary sessions, bible studies, worship, meals, and receptions. It was a wonderful week of connecting with old friends and making new connections. Some of the actions that were taken by the assembly included: the official launch to the re-branded ELCA Malaria Campaign; The social statement: "Genetics, Faith, and Responsibility" was adopted; the review process for social statements was adopted; 2012-1013 budget proposals were adopted; Living into the Future Together (LIFT) and implementing resolutions were adopted; and memorials and constitutional changes were adopted. Please see MaryJo Rodriguez or Amber Shearer for a form or if you need assistance in filling out the form. E-tithing can be setup for weekly, monthly, or however you choose to do the tithing. There is no cost for the e-tithing (unless your bank charges fees for these types of transactions). The e-tithing can be started as soon as September 1.

FUNDRAISER FOR BARREN'S BELL TOWER – We will have a jar/jug at the back of the church for our "bell tower fund". The bell tower is in desperate need of painting, and council has approved the estimate Carl has received for this job. We would like to raise enough money to cover this cost. VIDEO STUDY RETREAT – All are invited to attend a three-day video study from Tuesday, **August 30** to Thursday, **September 1** at Barren's Church House. The sessions will be facilitated by Pastor Debbie and will include a discussion on the video: *The Mudhouse Sabbath* by Lauren Winner. The same session will be presented two times per day – one at 9:30AM and again at 7:00PM to accommodate those who work during the day. You may attend either one per day, and each session will be approximately 1½ hours in duration. **Excerpt from back cover of the video:** “It’s not just that Jesus was a Jew, Jesus still is a Jew. Engaging Jewish practice and tradition is one important way of overcoming the gaps that we sometimes feel exists between Jesus and ourselves.” So begins Lauren Winner on the powerful new DVD: *Seven ways of Christian Formation Inspired by the Jewishness of Jesus*. Designed to be a course in Christian formation. This video will challenge you to:

- Encounter the Jewish context that nurtured Jesus

Dear Faith United Lutheran Parish,

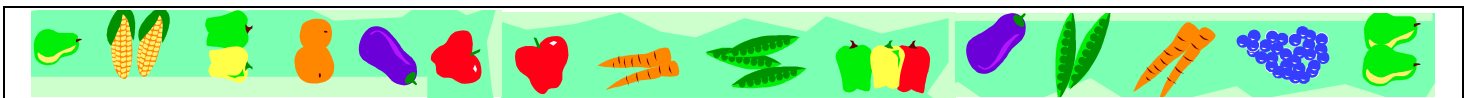

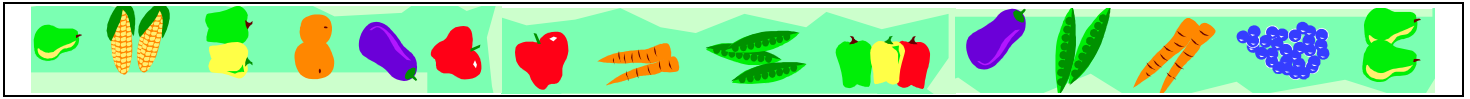

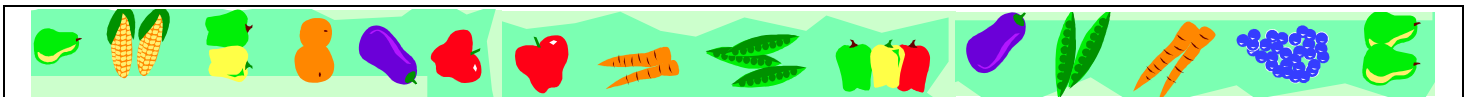

- It's Tuesday – parish council has decided to continue for now; the next one will be at Barren's, November 8, 6:15 pm, game night w/covered dish dinner.

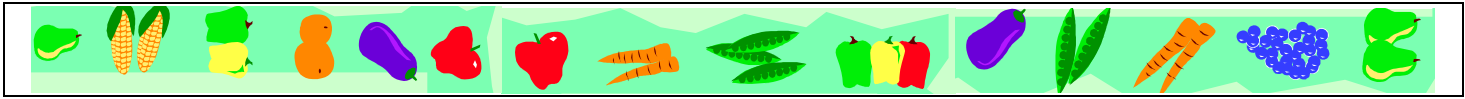
New Business

Old Business:

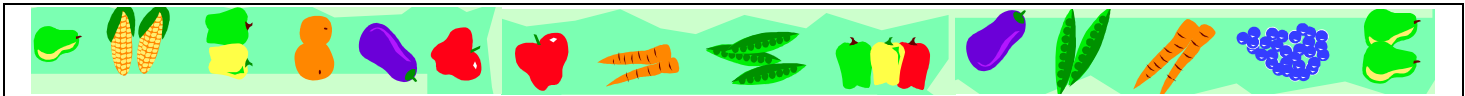

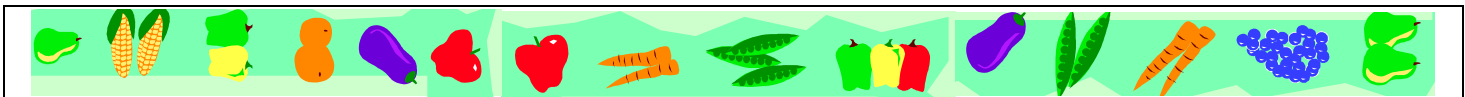


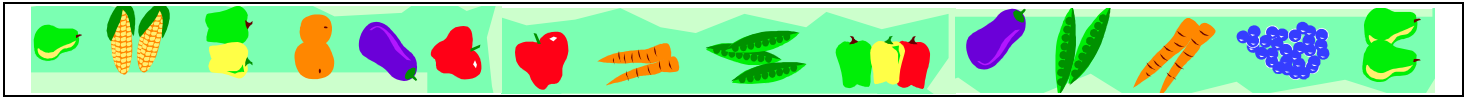

Youth: Youth need to work on calendar and plan a girl's sleepover before September. It's Tuesday: Nov. 8th (Election Day) family game night.

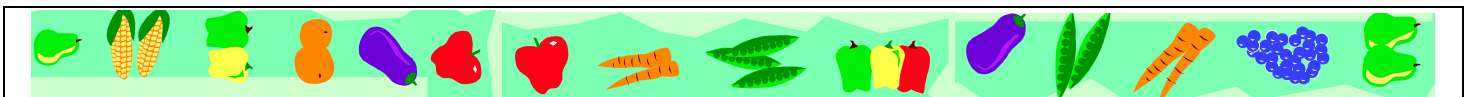
